If so why not do this >>>



Makes sense to me. This RV garage belongs to my friend, Harvey. Many of you have met him. This is just the back garage; he also has a 3-car garage in front of his house.

That lift is a 7000# machine that's uses both electricity and hydraulics.

Before he was able to have it installed in mid-December he had to replace the 4" concrete floor with rebar 6" on square concrete that is 6" deep. The concrete had to cure a month before the install. It requires 220V's.

The purchase and install was done by Service Tech in Simi Valley. It took a four man team to do the install in one day. Service Tech sells services and installs new and used lifts. They have been in business about 30 years. Their phone # is 805-526-1262
