What am I still hoping to find but probably will not find? 1933 Dealer plates for motor cycles and trailers, the three exempt trailer, the PS & US motor cycle plates. Lastly the US plate. If you see any of these at a swap meet, GIVE me a call!

WHAT LETTERS MEAN ON AUTO LICENSE PLATES - primarily 20's & 30's

Noting license plates of other cars, many motorists probably wonder at the meaning of the different letters used as a prefix to the numbers. The answer is provided by the California State Automobile association in the following summary of explanation received from the division or registration, department of

motor vehicles: Any single plain letter—an ordinary passenger car. E in a diamond—a state-owned vehicle of any kind. E in an oval—a county-owned vehicle of any kind. E in a square—a city-owned vehicle of any kind. PC—a pneumatic-tired vehicle. SC—a sold-tired commercial vehicle. PT—a pneumatic-tired trailer. ST—a solid-tired trailer. PS—a vehicle owned by a franchised public carrier or a corporation paying franchise tax in lieu of all other taxes. DLR—a car owned by an automobile dealer. Also appears on trucks with similar significance. The additional small letter designates which set of plates belong to that deal, A meaning his first set, B the second, etc. Some dealers have many sets. US—a vehicle owned by the United States, or a diplomatic or consular personage accredited to the United States. About 1880 of these in use in California. S in red—car owned by a state senator. The number is the number of his senatorial district. A in green—a car owned by a member of the state assembly. The number is the number of his assembly district. X in a hexagon—irrigation and reclamation districts. UR—a vehicle operated by a cooperative unemployment relief agency. BE over PC, SC, PT, or ST—pneumatic or solid tired truck or trailer operating under State board of equalization permit.
